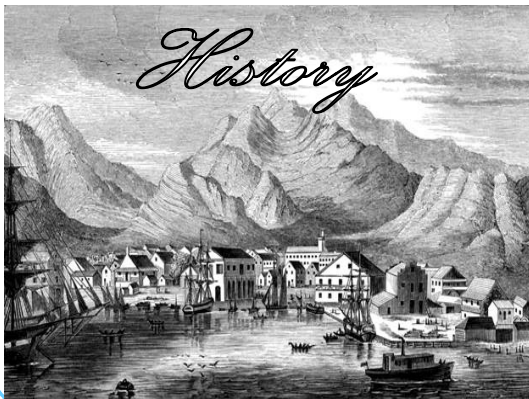

## Serving The Business Community Since 1850



The Chamber was established when the California Gold Rush of 1848 created an overwhelming demand for food and supplies from Honolulu. Goods and people flowed back and forth between the ports of Honolulu and San Francisco. A small group of merchants, who realized that to secure the advantages the Islands had to offer for commerce, decided to work together and establish common goals and policies for trade and commerce, along with addressing the concerns of the island community. In 1850, ten of the city’s leading businessmen signed the constitution of a chamber of commerce.

The Chamber became the leading organization representing the interest of all Hawaii’s business community and established some of Hawaii’s most respected organizations.
