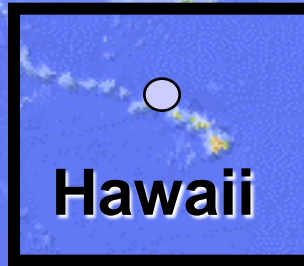

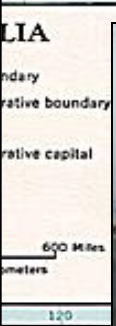

Hawaii Economic Impact



- Population at MCB Hawaii, Kaneohe Bay:
 - Approx. 9,400 Active Duty Military
 - Approx. 4,600 Family Members
 - Approx. 1,200 civilian employees
 - Approx. 21,000 total
(includes local retirees)
- \$633M per year into the local economy
- MCB Hawaii is Windward Oahu's largest employer



Military Construction (MILCON) Projects

- FY12 & beyond planned projects include:
 - MCAS operations complex
 - HMLA hangar & apron
 - Communications & info systems facility
 - Armory addition
 - Consolidated garrison aid station
 - Artillery battery complex (part of 'GTF')
 - WWTP redundancy/electrical upgrades
 - MCTAB MOUT
 - Total value - \$231.4M
